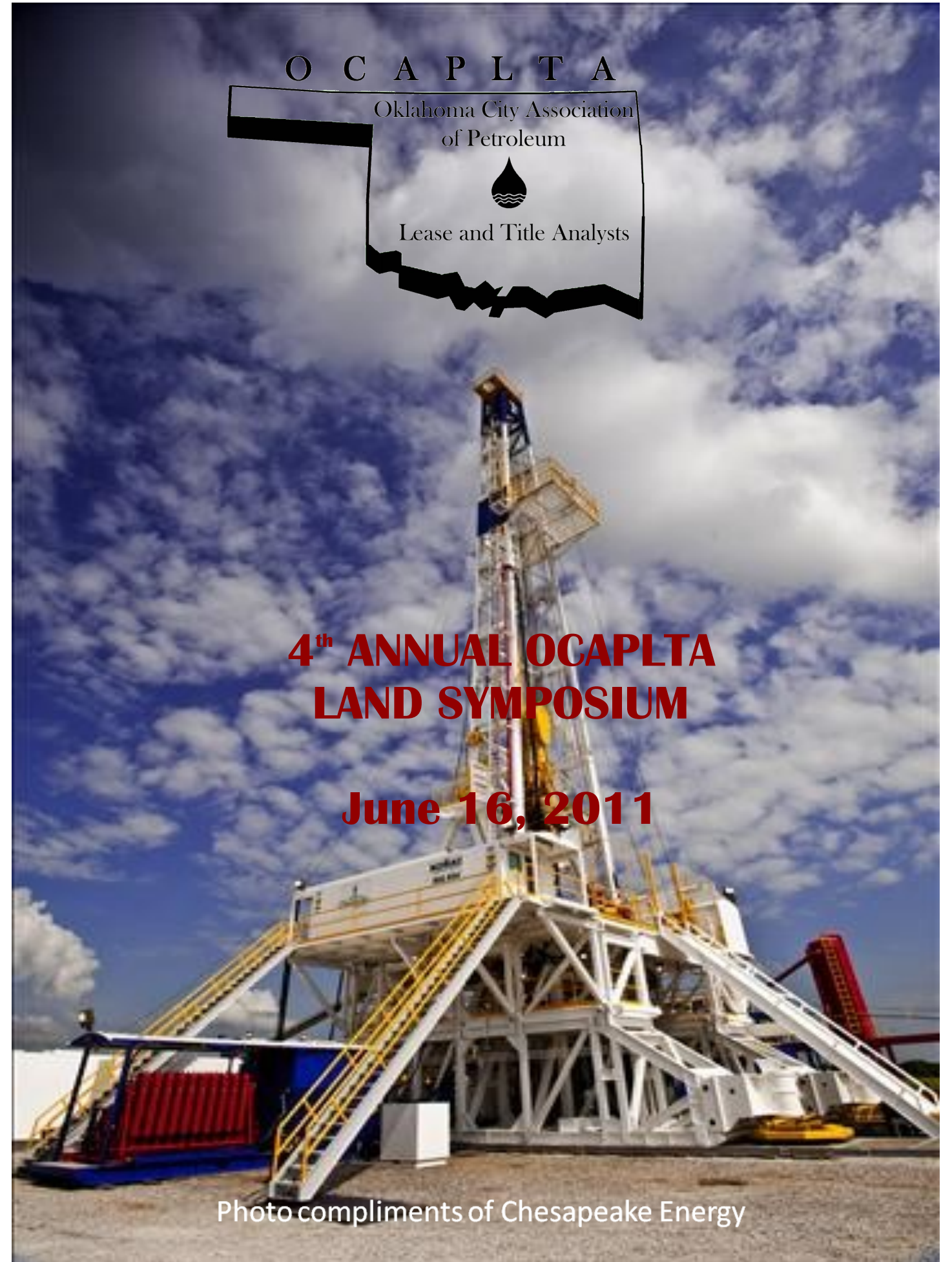

## Speaker Information:

### **Bob Costello-**

Bob graduated from OU in 1981 with a degree in Petroleum Land Management, and immediately went to work as a landman at Getty Oil Company in the New Orleans District office. He went back to law school following the Getty/Texaco merger, graduating from the University of Tulsa in 1988. He went into private practice in Oklahoma City focusing on oil and gas litigation representing operated and non operated interest owners in Federal and State Courts. After representing Chesapeake in several cases, Bob was eventually convinced to take an in-house position with Chesapeake in 2000, when the company had less than 700 employees. He left the status of "employee" in 2001 to help start a land service business, and continued to represent Chesapeake in litigation matters for the next 5 years. In 2006, Bob officially returned to Chesapeake as Division Counsel for the Northern Division which is his current position. His responsibilities include land transactions, regulatory matters, and dispute resolution in Oklahoma, Arkansas, Texas Panhandle and Kansas.

Bob is the former Chair of the Oklahoma Bar Association's Mineral Law Section.

### **Owen Anderson-**

Owen L. Anderson is the Eugene Kuntz Chair in Law in Oil, Gas & Natural Resources at The University of Oklahoma College of Law. He is also a Distinguished Lecturer at the University of Dundee, a Senior Fellow at the University of Melbourne, and a Faculty Visitor at the University of Sydney. In addition, Professor Anderson's teaching experience includes the University of Houston, Southern Methodist University, Texas Tech University, the University of Texas, the University of Wyoming, University of North Dakota (his alma mater), Qatar University (Qatar), the University of Calgary (Canada), the University of Oslo (Norway), the University of São Paulo (Brazil), Wonkwang University (Korea), Agonisto Neto University (Angola), Chulalongkorn University (Thailand), and various venues in Brazil, China, Italy, Jordan, Mexico, Russia, Canada, and the United Kingdom.

Professor Anderson is a member of the Association of International Petroleum Negotiators; a Trustee of the Rocky Mountain Mineral Law Foundation; a Trustee of the Energy and Mineral Law Foundation; and a member of the Advisory Board for the International Oil and Gas Educational at the Center for American and International Law. He is a member of the American Association of Professional Landmen, the Energy Bar Association, the International Bar Association, the American Bar Association, the Oklahoma Legal Committee to the Interstate Oil & Gas Compact Commission, and the Oklahoma City Mineral Lawyers Society. He is an Editor of the OIL AND GAS REPORTER, a Life Commissioner for the Uniform Laws Commission, a member of the American Law Institute, and Editor in Chief of the Texas Title Standards. He is licensed to practice law in North Dakota, Oklahoma, and Texas.

His energy law experience includes general counsel to the North Dakota Industrial (Oil and Gas Conservation) Commission, general counsel to the North Dakota Board of University & School Lands, in-house lawyer for Kerr-McGee Corporation, a consulting attorney for Devon Energy Corporation, an arbitrator, and a legal and policy consultant to the oil and gas industry and to host governments.

Professor Anderson is co-author of INTERNATIONAL PETROLEUM TRANSACTIONS, a textbook on international petroleum transactions law; co-author of HEMINGWAY OIL AND GAS LAW AND TAXATION, a one volume treatise; co-editor of CASES AND MATERIALS ON OIL & GAS LAW, a casebook on United States oil and gas law; co-author of annual supplements to KUNTZ ON OIL AND GAS LAW, a multi-volume treatise; a contributing author to WATERS AND WATER RIGHTS, a multi-volume treatise; a contributing author of INTERNATIONAL PETROLEUM EXPLORATION AND EXPLOITATION AGREEMENTS. He has authored numerous articles on petroleum and natural resources law.

### **Drew L. Kershen-**

Drew L. Kershen is the Earl Sneed Centennial Professor of Law at the University of Oklahoma, College of Law, at Norman, Oklahoma where he has been teaching since 1971.

He obtained a B.A. from the Univ. of Notre Dame (1966), a J.D. from the Univ. of Texas (1968) and a Master's in Law (LL.M.) from Harvard Univ. (1975). He is admitted to the Oklahoma Bar and the Bar of the United States Court for the Western District of Oklahoma.

Professor Kershen concentrates his teaching, research and writing in the areas of agricultural law and water law. He has been teaching water law since 1990. His work is part of the Natural Resources curriculum at the College of Law.

### **Doug Potter, CPL, CPLTA, CDOA-**

Douglas M. Potter received his BS in Geology in 1976 and MBA in Finance in 1981 from the University of Colorado in Boulder. As a Geologist, Potter worked for CONOCO in Wyoming [Uranium] and Cordillera Exploration in Bolivia [Gold].
